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A parent, authorized guardian or someone with power of attorney can register for persons who are unable to do so for themselves.

- Children and Youth with Special Needs (physical, mental, behavioral, etc.)
- Persons with Disabilities
- Persons with Chronic Medical Conditions
- Persons with Mental Health Conditions
- Elderly Persons
- Non-English Speakers

About Your Privacy



How It Works

Any resident of Warren and Forest County, Pennsylvania with special needs who requires additional or special assistance in a police, fire, or medical emergency can sign up in the Warren County 911 Special Needs Registry.

A special need can be any physical, mental, or behavioral condition or disability that might prevent someone from leaving their home quickly during an emergency.

This registry is voluntary and HIPAA compliant.

The information you enter will be attached to your address. It will be made available to 911 dispatchers so they can tell first responders like fire fighters, police officers, and medical personnel what type of special support is needed.

Your information will be used for this purpose only.

Your information will be shared with local, county, state, and federal agencies for emergency planning and response.

While providing for those with special needs, the County will make every effort to respect their privacy and confidentiality.

Frequently Asked Questions

How long will my information in the registry be active?

Information is held for three years. After three years, you will receive an email reminder to resubmit your information into the registry.

How much information is needed?

For example, listing any medicines taken to manage conditions (e.g. epilepsy, etc.).

The registry is completely voluntary. It's up to you to decide what information you want to include.

How does the registry work for persons staying at group homes?

If you are authorized, you can register for the person using their group home address.

How about for persons who stay at more than one address?

Register each address separately.

How about for persons (e.g. students, retirees) who only reside in Warren or Forest County part of the year?

You can register your Warren or Forest County address. Remember to update your entry if the situation changes.

How about for persons who have issues using or accessing technology and the internet?

If you are authorized, you can register for the person using their information.
